#### IV. Review of 2021 Season

a) Finances

Halley discussed the year-end balance (2021) relative to the 2020 season. The dramatic spikes and drop in revenue was due to the payment schedule of the Canada Summer Jobs program. The CSJ grants from the government were deposited into our account in two installments. The funds were then immediately used to pay out the four employees. There was a net difference of about \$4000 less than the same time last year due to the Nighthawks having to cover some of the costs of paying the CSJ youth. In all the 2021 balance in august was \$7,477.51.

b) Paid Staff

Halley reiterated that the Nighthawks received funding for four (\$) CSJ youth for the 2021 season, one more than the previous season. Thanks to the grant we were able to successfully run programs and provide youth from within the community full time summer jobs. We spent over \$2000 on non-CSJ staff in 2021. This money goes directly back into the community and supports our members.

## c) Membership

Halley discussed membership relative to the previous season. Due to the pandemic, membership was understandably still recovering. The most exciting part is that we are maintaining a high number (37%) of new players. This is a very promising growth factor.

Summer/Fall/Winter 2021:

- 75 unique players across summer, fall, winter programs.
- 27 were brand new to NN (37%),
- 7 returning NN that did not register in 2019 (12%),
- 38 returning from the 2019 season (51%)

Summer/Fall 2020:

- 26 were brand new to NN (35%),
- 18 returning NN that did not register in 2019 (24%),
- 30 returning from the 2019 season (41%)

A lot of our growth is concentrated at our youngest age groups which is exactly what we like to see.

Halley shared the program started on February 21st. The program runs every Sunday with three groups under Return to Play Protocols modified for the indoor facility. Winter 2021: 3 unique, 24 total athletes from U10 to 18+

Halley noted this upcoming season will be our first season where we return to regular programming, bring back the junior festivals, and the Ontario Summer Games (OSG).

b) Safe Sport

 The Nighthawks participated in the Ottawa Sport Council's Safe Sport Pilot Project. Halley, Maureen, and Chloe participated in a 2-day workshop where they shared their experiences, club successes, and opinions on what our club would need out of a safe sport toolkit. Turns out our club was one of 3 of the 12 organizations that are successfully implementing the toolkit and we are very ahead of the other organizations.
